## 3 WAYS TO KEEP YOUR GOALS


It's exciting to set New Year's Resolutions and start off a fresh new year with big goals and ambitions. But the reality, as we all know, is that most resolutions are not kept. Common personal goals are to quit smoking, lose weight, work out regularly, volunteer, save for a vacation, etc.

4. **Set Your Appointment With A Dentist:** Nothing good happens to your teeth when you avoid the dentist. If nothing else, go get a cleaning, that will do wonders for your teeth and not break the bank account. (See Page 4 for dental plans.)



## Should You Get The Shingles Shot?

Your risk of shingles and post-herpetic neuralgia (PHN) increases as you get older. CDC recommends that people 60 years old and older get shingles vaccine to prevent shingles and PHN.

### Who Should Get Shingles Vaccine?

People 60 years of age or older should get shingles vaccine. They should get the vaccine whether or not they recall having had chickenpox, which is caused by the same virus as shingles. Studies show that more than 99% of Americans aged 40 and older have had chickenpox, even if they don't remember getting the disease. There is no maximum age for getting shingles vaccine.

Even if you have had shingles, you can still receive shingles vaccine to help prevent future occurrences of the disease. There is no specific length of time you must wait after having shingles before receiving shingles vaccine, but generally you should make sure the shingles rash has disappeared before getting vaccinated. The decision on when to get vaccinated should be made with your healthcare provider.

Shingles vaccine is approved by the Food and Drug Administration for people aged 50 years and older. However, CDC does not have a recommendation for routine use of shingles vaccine in people 50 through 59 years old. Protection from shingles vaccine lasts about 5 years, so adults vaccinated before they are 60 years old might not be protected later in life when the risk for shingles and its complications are greatest.

**Note: Don't pay more than \$100 for the shingles shot. Costco will administer the shot and you don't need a membership to go to the pharmacy.**

When Susan first noticed the cavity about six months ago, she tried to book a dentist's appointment, but she had trouble finding a practice that would take her Medicare insurance plan.


"Every time I tried to schedule it, it was a two to three month wait" for an appointment.

So she waited some more—and tried to ignore the pain that was now shooting through her jaw.
