#### PRIMARY CARE DOCTORS MAY NO LONGER BE NEEDED

Most primary care doctor's days are busy. Seeing patient after patient, they try to provide the most patient-centric, evidence based care that they can. But with the new healthcare reform, doctors tell me that 80-85% of the patients they see can be seen by a nurse practitioner or a physician's assistant. "So why did I train for an extra 3-4 years as a doctor, incur several hundred thousand dollars in debt, and go through years of residency training to do the same work as someone who has done a fraction of this?" as one doctor said.

The Affordable Care Act is already changing medicine – If nurse practitioners and physician assistants can see 80-85% of the patients a primary doctor can see, and require only 4 or 5 years of post-graduate training – and not the 7 or 8 that most primary care physicians receive – then we need to develop systems that select the 15-20% of patients that need a physician. As one doctor noted, "Primary doctors are going to be overwhelmed not only with the 30 million new patients that now have insurance but with all the free screenings doctors will now have to preform at no cost."

In the future, medical groups will need a mix of Physician Assistants, Nurses Assistants, and MDs, break down their job responsibilities, descriptions and levels of care in order to separate the 15-20% of the people that are sick and really need a doctor. Not doing this is a systems failure with broad implications for patient and provider satisfaction, healthcare spending, access to care, and healthcare reform.

One of the single most asked questions concerning the extra benefits with your plan is about the vision coverage. <u>If you have a Medicare Supplement Plan</u>, You pay \$40 for routine eye exams and can have that preformed at LensCrafters, Pearle Vision, Sears Optical, Target Optical and JC Penney Optical. There you will receive up to 30% on frames and lenses.

## Healthcare Reform is Moving Forward in California:

The federal Affordable Care Act takes effect in January 2014, when most Americans will realize the requirement to buy health insurance or pay a penalty. State lawmakers need to pass a series of rules that will clear the way for enrollment in a new state-run insurance market next fall. One such requirement is for insurers to cover consumers who have preexisting medical conditions and limits on how much they can charge based on age. California has already laid much of the groundwork of the Affordable Care Act, being the first state to establish an insurance exchange after Congress passed the legislation in 2010. More than 30 other states are now seeking federal help to initate their state's insurance exchange. Millions of Californians will be able to purchase coverage, with federal subsidies earmarked for families earning about \$92,000 or less annually.

One of the most significant proposals will be an expansion of Medi-Cal, the state's health insurance program for the poor. About 2 million low-income Californians would be newly eligible under the expansion, with the federal government subsidizing costs for the first three years. After that, the state would be responsible for a portion of the bill. California signed up more than 550,000 low-income people in a temporary program, and they are expected to automatically move into Medi-Cal in 2014.

Lawmakers will also consider legislation that would create a health plan for people who can't afford insurance on the open market, yet earn too much money to qualify for Medi-Cal. This option, known as the Basic Health Plan, would provide coverage for individuals with incomes between 133% and 200% of the federal poverty level, or between \$15,000 and \$21,800 a year.

Although this will have little effect on members already on Medicare, most have kids that this will effect. I'll try and keep you updated on the coming changes.
